From the **Centering Prayer** group which meets at St Philip's on Tuesdays at 9.45 am During November Centering Prayer will feature the English Christian mystic known as Julian of Norwich. She lived during the European plague of the Black Death and experienced 'showings' which she sought to understand. *She asked Jesus, what was their meaning? He asked "what do you wish to know, your Lord's meaning in this thing? Know it well, love was his meaning. Who reveals it to you? Love. What did he reveal to you? Love. Why does he reveal it to you? For love. Remain in this and you will know more of the same."*

We are finding that our prayer practice helps us remain in this love.

We have received notification from **General Synod** informing us that the Family Violence Working Group is conducting a survey. Our Church is committed to supporting safe and loving homes and safe churches. Recognising that intimate partner violence, which forms part of domestic and family violence, is a serious and widespread problem, with enormous individual and community impacts and social costs – and the Church is not immune – our Church seeks to improve our policy and practice to respond to these difficult issues. General Synod is asking that current and former members of the Anglican Church take part in an anonymous online survey which contains questions about demographics (such as age and gender), personal experiences of intimate partner violence and ways in which the Anglican Church featured in your story.
