Centering Prayer & Lectio Divina

During November, in our Lectio Divina, we listen and reflect on writing by the English Christian mystic known as Julian of Norwich. Julian was born in 1343 and died after 1416. She wrote the best known surviving book in the English language written by a mystic "Mystery Revelation of Divine Love" or "Showings". For much of her life, Julian lived in permanent seclusion as an anchoress in a cell which was attached to St Julian's Church, Norwich. This was a time when the European plague of the Black Death swept through Europe first arriving at Norwich when Julian was six or seven. It was highly contagious; people died horribly, suddenly and in great numbers. Further outbreaks occurred unpredictably. It is estimated that in Norwich more than a third of the population perished and at least fifty percent of the Norwich clergy died. Julian does not write of the plague directly, nor of any other social and political events of her time, but her writings reveal deep sensitivity to suffering and dying. She questions persistently why suffering should be permitted at all in a universe loved by God. Yet, Julian's conviction is that "all will be well and very kind of thing will be well". Yes, every kind of thing! Yes, all!
